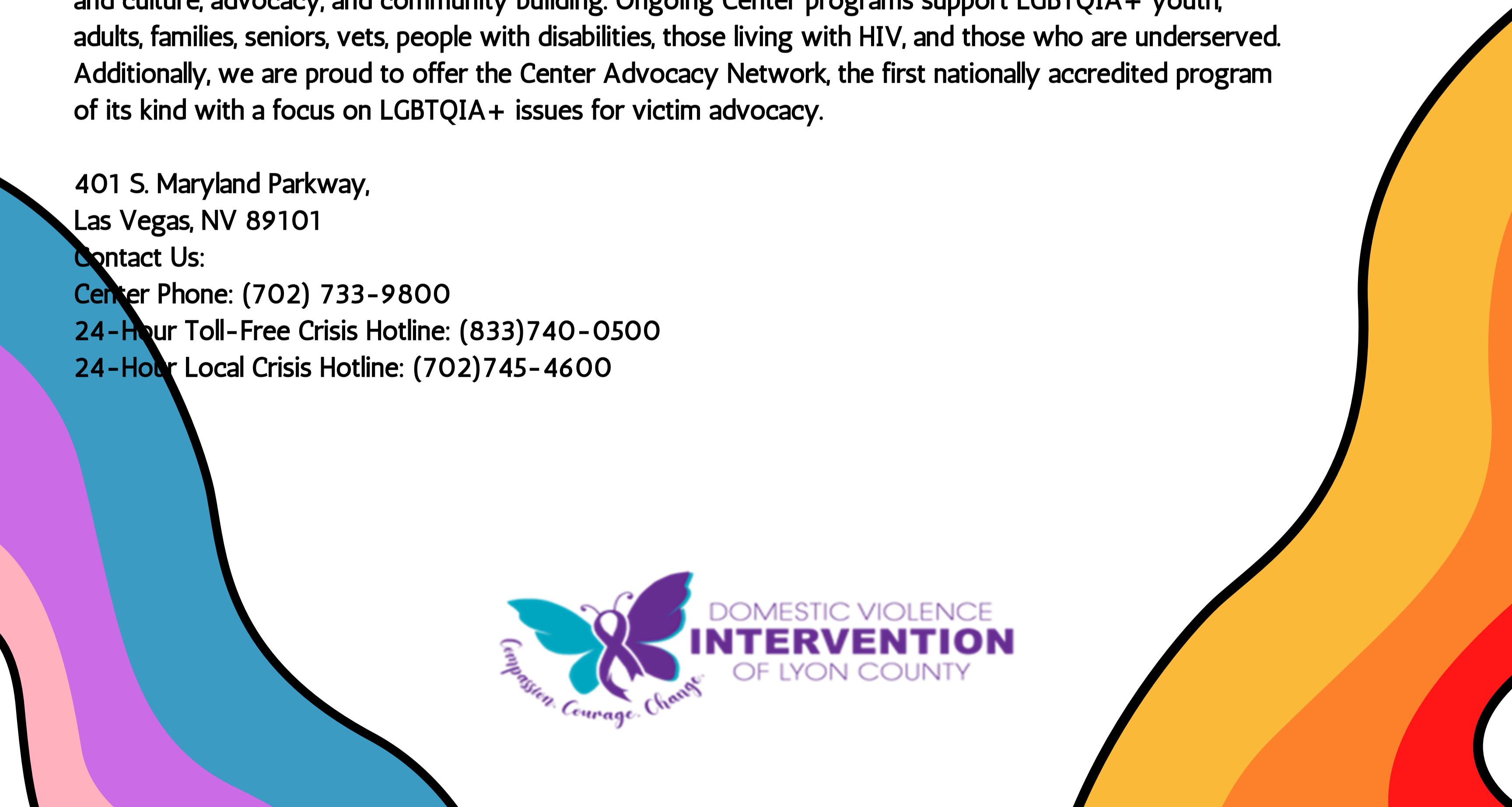

Northern Nevada Hopes Hope Springs

With our community's generous support, we have built Northern Nevada's first bridge-housing community – Hope Springs. Located at 1920 E 4th St near downtown Reno, Hope Springs fills a hole in the Northern Nevada housing continuum, providing safe, dignified housing for the most disenfranchised members of our community.

30 individual sleeping units surround a central 3,200 sq ft facility with restrooms, showers, laundry, a kitchen, and community space. Residents will be connected to our life-saving care and life-changing services through the HOPES clinic. And very unique to Hope Springs, the facility accepts residents with dogs, has a dog park built into the campus (shown above), and provides access to veterinary and training services.

Northern Nevada HOPES is located at 580 West 5th Street in downtown Reno.

OUR Place - The Reno Initiative for Shelter and Equality

It is specifically designed to provide a warm, safe, and home-like environment where guests feel welcomed and wanted. This "Person First" approach is meant to remove the stigma of poverty and provide a conducive space for healing and growth.

Through almost a decade of working with our neighbors who live outside, we have found that they are capable, resourceful, creative, and resilient people. Life is about living, not just surviving and we recognize that when individuals are trusted and invested in, they thrive. Our Guests tend to meet and exceed their goals by building trusting relationships, investing time and energy, and learning to advocate for themselves.

Moving indoors can be an isolating and lonely experience, this is why RISE and Washoe County Humans Services Agency offer wrap-around services in order to assist those facing daunting transitions. We are not just providers; we are a team of individuals who walk the path with our Guests. Staff, peers, volunteers, and the Guest's support network all bring healing and unity to achieve hope. Our model is one of collaboration with peer-led services. We are compassion driven, and outcome-based with a focus on long-term housing solutions that fit the needs of individuals. We recognize that diversity makes us stronger and embrace human uniqueness. Rather than seeking to build a program that pushes people to adapt, we collaborate to build responsive interventions.

Our Place is more than a bed; it is a second home. Guests find themselves in an environment where they and their families have a therapeutic place to heal.

OUR Place does not discriminate against trans, non-binary, gender non-conforming, nor sexual orientation.

Eddy House

Eddy House is a daytime drop-in center and overnight shelter for homeless, runaway, foster, and other at-risk youth. Eddy House works with youth to develop life and job skills necessary for sustainable independence with the goal of ending youth homelessness in Northern Nevada. No one who comes to Eddy House for assistance is turned away as we understand our role in eliminating the factors that lead to homelessness in our community. From outreach to aftercare, Eddy House meets youth where they are at and will help youth reach their success through individualized case plans. Our 24-hour facility includes an overnight shelter for up to 23 young adults and a results-oriented Community Living Program for 29 individuals. Through various programs and services and over 55 community partners, Eddy House provides vital life skills classes, workforce development, healthcare assistance, counseling, and more.

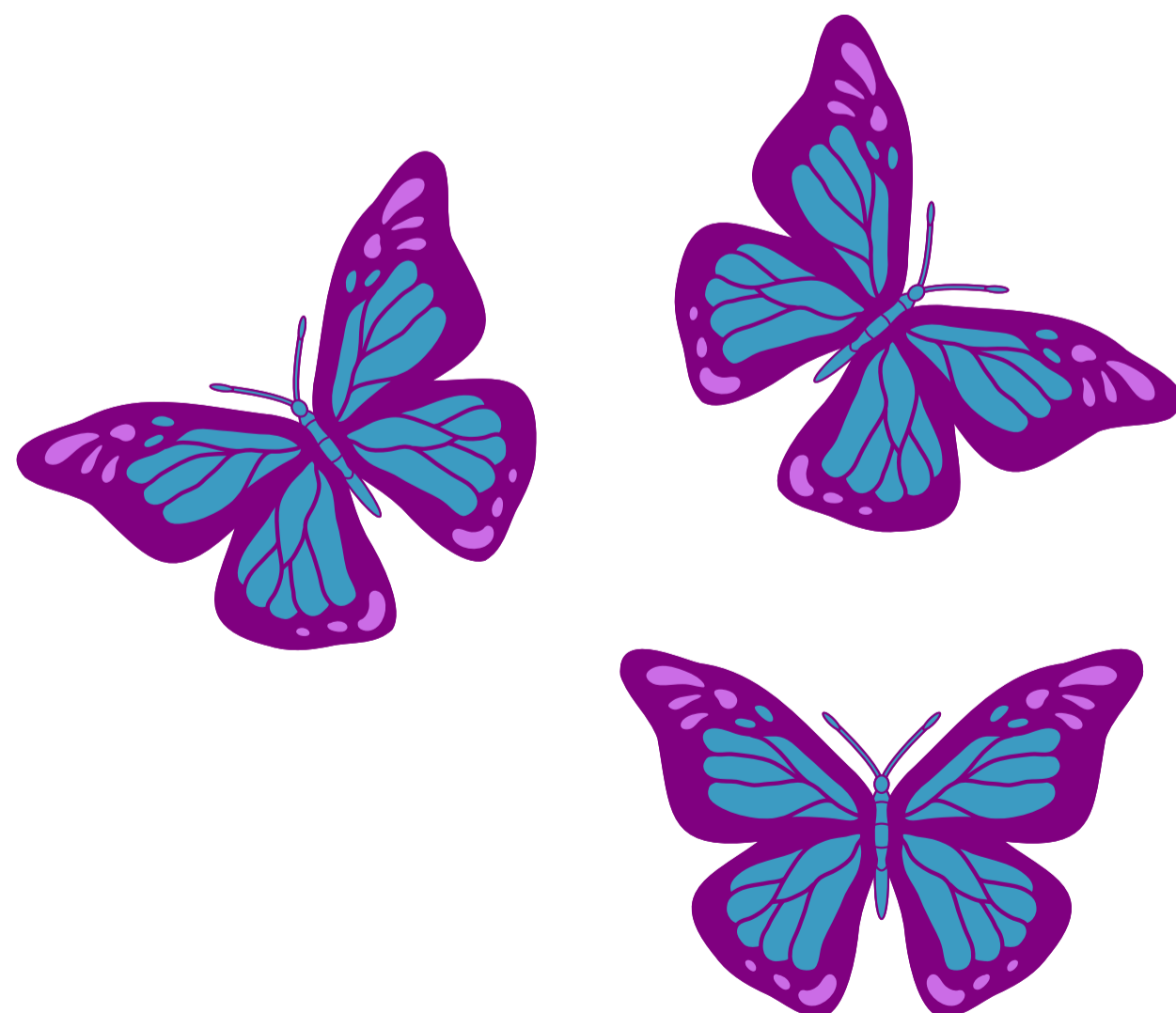

What is a hotline?

The Network/La Red's 24-hour hotline provides confidential emotional support, information, referrals, safety planning, and crisis intervention for lesbian, gay, bisexual, queer and/or transgender (LGBQ/T) folks, as well as folks in SM/kink and polyamorous communities who are being abused or have been abused by a partner. We also offer information and support to friends, family, or co-workers on the issue of domestic violence in LGBQ/T communities. All hotline staff are trained in domestic violence, peer counseling, crisis intervention, and safety planning. You don't have to leave or want to leave your relationship to get support.

NiCE plans to develop a state-wide web site, with sections for each county, to which LGBTQ organizations around the state can provide the link.

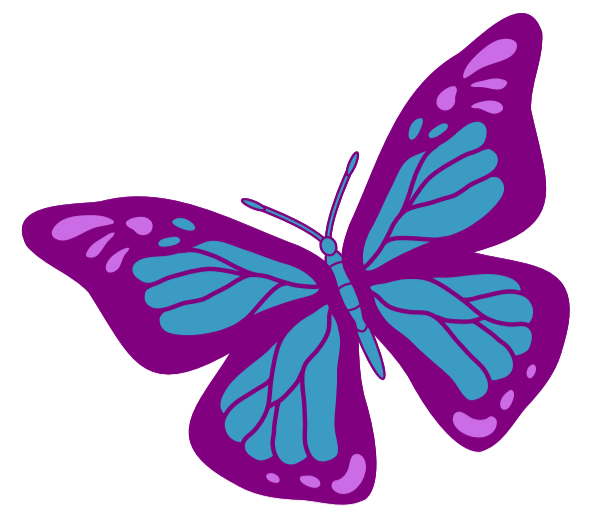
